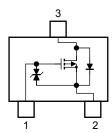

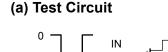

Switching Time Test Circuit



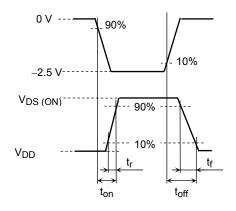
